



What a COVID-19 Year for the Roadrunners!

The 2020 Roadrunner operation stopped in mid-March. On June 1, our hospitals reopened for patient transportation and on June 9, Syria transported our first patient to Erie. The hospitals Philadelphia, Cincinnati, and Erie then came out with new rules, each location was different. Then Erie hospital transportation was to cease. But a few days later with new regulations, from Imperial headquarters, we were in operation again.

By the end of June, two van COVID-19 kits were made and stored with the van keys. The kit contains a list of questions to be asked to the drivers, patients, and parents before they enter the van. Plus, infrared thermometers were purchased, to be used on the foreheads of all, and recorded on patient trip log. Extra masks, hand cleaner, spray disinfect, and gloves were also included in the kit.

Many trips were scheduled, then canceled, and then rescheduled, but the number of summer trips were few. From early June thru end of August, drivers Joe Pauline, Terry Steinheiser, Don Wiles, Ron Plesh, George White, Al Douglas, and Richard Roell, had driven patients to hospitals. By September and October our trips were almost back to normal. Many of our drivers have medical problems and were not able to drive, but we did recruit two new drivers: Bill Woods, and G. Fredrick (Fritz) Richardson.

Bill Woods went to Cincinnati, for his first trip. He had to drive north for an Amish boy, then southwest to Cincinnati. Bill and Rich Roell left in the early morning dark, and arrived home late that evening, in the dark. Most trips are not that long.

On October 19, Fritz Richardson was headed to Erie for his first trip. Dave Travaglio was his partner, and they were to meet Andy B., another Amish boy. They arrived at his home early, in the dark. Mom came out to tell them that Andy was not feeling good, and the trip had to be canceled. Another trip to be rescheduled. About 15% of our trips get canceled and rescheduled during a normal year. It is much higher this year.

During September and October, several other drivers helped out, Max Smith, Bill Moisey, Shashi Patel, John Habel, and Mike Hoover all drove patients to our hospitals. Also, during these two months, 10 patients canceled and will reschedule their trips. For all of those trips, we had drivers scheduled to drive, and then they were disappointed when the trips were canceled. All but one were canceled before the drivers picked up a van.

Thank you Don Wiles and Ron Plesh for volunteering during these troubling times. Don was one of the first drivers to train Ron, we're not sure how many years ago that was. On August 4, they had to get up early and drive northeast, to pick up David S. in Sligo, PA, then drive northwest to Erie. This trip was Ron's 100th Shriners Hospital trip. They had to pick up Dave, a 3 year old Amish boy that was in an accident earlier in the summer. He and his father were riding in their horse-drawn buggy, when a fast moving car passed them and frightened the horse. Off the road they went, out of control and crashed. Somehow the boy was tossed, and the buggy wheel ran over and broke his leg. It was a miracle

they both were not killed. I was told the driver did not stop. August 4 was the day to get the cast off and try walking again, a big success. He had to go back to be reevaluated again in September. It was a bright, sunny, happy day, and David, Ron and Don will remember it forever. Thanks guys.

We were all hoping to have a garage built for our hospital vans this year, but COVID-19 has derailed and delayed our plans. We have not stopped the collection of funds for this project. If your Unit, Club, Caravan can help, please donate to the **Syria Holding Corp**., the special account to hold the van garage funds. We are half way to our fundraising goal. The Roadrunners thank you.

Notes from Shriners Children's – Erie

Notice the name change? Imperial is implementing a rebranding of the Shriners healthcare system, for many necessary reasons. Technically some sites (led by SC-Erie) are not really hospitals. As of now 6 of the 22 sites in the system are no longer qualified as hospitals; Shriners Hospital – Tampa is now Shriners Children's – Florida, SHC – Cincinnati is now SC – Ohio located in Dayton, etc. We will be known as Shriners Children's – Erie and will continue to provide our multiple services including; Outpatient Clinic, Surgery - both in-patient and outpatient (with partners Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, SC – Philadelphia, UPMC Hamot), Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Radiology, wheelchair fitting, Prosthetics and Orthotics (artificial limbs and braces), Nutrition counseling and support, Social Services and Family Support, and Gait Analysis and research Lab.

Shriners Hospital for Children – Erie was started by Zem Zem Temple in Erie in 1922. Initially a facility for chronic diseases (Polio, Tuberculosis, etc.). It has evolved into a site for specialty Pediatric Orthopedic care. Fifteen Temples support SC-Erie including Ontario, Michigan, Ohio, Pennsylvania, New York, Maryland, and West Virginia. The Road Runners from Syria Temple continue to assist with transportation needs of our Kids. Nobles Harry Truax, Barry Hootman, M.D., and Jim Mitch are full members of the Board of Governors of Shriners Children's – Erie representing Syria Temple.

Health care is rapidly changing, but with improving technologies comes increasing costs. Telemedicine is being introduced into the Shrine System and is but one example of our commitment to quality care.

Unfortunately, in this time of COVID-19, Temple and caravan fundraising has been quite limited, secondarily decreasing SC – Erie donations. I encourage all Nobles to consider a donation to Shriners Children's – Erie during the upcoming holiday season. If sent to Syria Temple, it will be forwarded. Be assured it will be used for the betterment of the lives of our Kids.

SHRINERS INTERNATIONAL BYLAWS PERTAINING TO ELECTIONS

§ 325.11 Election Regulations.

(a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a résumé consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.

(b) Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

(c) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

(d) Notice. At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section. Amend. 2011

§ 325.12 Postponed Election. If it is impossible to hold the election as required, or if it appears to the Imperial Potentate proper, he may grant a special dispensation changing the date of the annual election
