



Currently I am a life member of West Homestead Volunteer Fire Department and a lector at St Therese Church.



On Thursday, December 7, 2023, Syria Shriners, Shriners International and the estate of Joanne Hunkawitz entered a mediation session with retired judge Gary Caruso aimed at settling their dispute over proceeds of the estate.

settlement was reached, whereby Syria Shriners retains 78 per cent of the liquid assets in the estate and all real property and residual income from mineral rights on the real property.

There should be approximately \$2 million accruing to Syria Shriners from this bequest.

The main point of contact for both the Legion of Honor and the Sons of Veterans is our LOH Commander


